Annual WNA Cleanup is Saturday, May 9th

Let's clean up the neighborhood and get ready to enjoy the summer! The annual WNA Spring cleanup event will be on Saturday, May 9th from 8:00 a.m. to Noon. The collection site will be the North parking lot of Bryan Community School at Hawthorne and along 50th & M Street.

This is a great opportunity to clean up your home, garage and yard, and safely dispose of your unwanted items.

Items accepted for FREE include: furniture, lumber, screens, windows, doors, grills, landscape timbers, picnic tables, swing sets, broken fence panels, construction material, carpet, light fixtures, pipes, wiring, and non-freon appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, and hot water heaters). With generous support from Firestone Complete Auto Care at 300 N 66th Street we are also able to accept used tires. Goodwill will be collecting household electronics, computers, monitors, clothing and other good condition household items.

Appliances containing Freon (refrigerators, deep freezers, dehumidifiers) will be accepted for a nominal fee.

Free brush disposal is offered to WNA residents from Hofeling Enterprises. Take your brush to 2200 South Folsom Court on the morning of May 9th and mention that you are from Witherbee Neighborhood. A limited number of brush disposal coupons will be available. These coupons are good all summer and can be used to haul a load of brush to the Lincoln Transfer Station for free.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include trash, leaves, grass clippings, liquids of any kind (including paint, thinners, stains) ammunition/explosives, LP gas cylinders and CRT televisions.

Several volunteer crews will be picking up litter along the major streets rights of way, around the schools and in the neighborhood parks.

If you need help hauling items to the collection site call Mike Kreikemeier at 402-477-9194 to make an appointment. The items must be easily accessible and placed near the curb if possible for our volunteers to pickup. With help from Goodwill Industries, EcoStores Nebraska, and Firestone Complete Auto Care this cleanup event has grown from just disposing of unwanted items in the landfill to recycling and reusing as many items as possible. EcoStores Nebraska, located at 530 West P Street, has generously provided a trailer to accept construction material and items such as windows and doors from building/remodeling projects as well as leftover lawn and landscaping materials. Goodwill Industries will recycle and reuse most of the electronics and household items collected. As mentioned above, Firestone accepts the used tires collected for no fee.

Many volunteers are required to make this cleanup event a success. Please consider joining us for a few hours to help clean up the neighborhood. We also need volunteers with pickup trucks and/or trailers. Vouchers are provided to volunteer haulers to help defray the cost of gas. Volunteers help make a great place to live even better! 
