Spring is here and it's time for the annual neighborhood improvement project, the award winning WNA Neighborhood Cleanup.

The WNA cleanup will be on Saturday, May 7th running from 8 am-Noon.

The collection site will be along M Street directly North of Bryan Community School (48th & M Street). The Witherbee Cleanup is a great way to dispose of unwanted items when cleaning up your garage, your yard & your home.

Volunteers make it happen. Please consider helping out. Litter pick up volunteers get exercise and make the neighborhood look great! It's a great way to spend a Saturday

morning and a wonderful way to meet your neighbors. Litter pick up counts for service hours at all Lincoln High Schools.

Tires are taken to Firestone Complete Auto Care at 300 N 66th Street to be recycled. Complete Auto Care has been a generous cleanup partner for several years. No tires mounted on rims are accepted.

The metal & household appliances (washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, etc) are hauled to Alter Metal Recycling. Appliances with freon are safely discharged before recycling.

This year we encourage neighborhood residents to donate construction material and items such as windows and doors from building/remodeling projects as well as leftover lawn and landscaping materials and furniture in good condition to the new Habitat for Humanity ReStore at 5601 S 59th Street. Goodwill Industries will recycle and reuse electronics and household items collected.

Brush coupons are also available. Brush coupons allow dumping a load of brush (sticks, twigs, small branches - NO LEAVES or TRASH) at the 48th Street transfer station for free. Only the coupons are provided. Picking up and hauling brush are not part of the WNA cleanup.

Many hard to get rid of items, such as mattresses, box springs and old furniture can be disposed of by bringing them to the collection area.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include trash, leaves, grass clippings, liquids of any kind (including paint, thinners, stains) ammunition/explosives, LP gas cylinders and CRT televisions and CRT computer monitors.

If you need help hauling items to the collection site email Mike Kreikemeier at mbk@windstream.net or call the WNA phone line at 402-413-0156 to make an appointment by leaving a message. The items must be easily accessible and placed near the curb if possible for our volunteers to pickup.



Attendance High for March WNA Meeting

The passion for Woods Park brought over 50 neighbors to the March WNA meeting at Lefler Middle School. Lynn Johnson, Director of Lincoln Parks & Recreation and JJ Yost, Planning & Facilities Manager presented information about the history of Woods Park, the Woods Park Master Plan, the new playground equipment and the new basketball court. The proposed Tennis Center expansion was of great interest to many in attendance. The agreement for the use of the Kiwanis baseball field by Nebraska Wesleyan University was also discussed.



The Woods Park Master Plan is a tool to guide the use and development



of the park. Woods Park is fairly unique, most Lincoln parks do not have a master plan. Major changes to the park require approval by the Lincoln City Council to update the master plan. The most recent change to the Woods Park Master was in 2017-18 when the Health Department parking lot was expanded.

The last major update to the Tennis Center was started in 2014 with the "Taking the Game to the Community" campaign. The campaign raised money to replace the "tennis bubbles" with a more permanent structure for 6 indoor tennis courts and improvements for 12 outdoor courts. The majority of the indoor tennis building and improvements were completed in 2017. The Woods Tennis Center would like to

expand once again to complete the previously approved Phase 2 with 4 additional indoor tennis courts and a new proposal to add 3 additional outdoor tennis courts. The new proposal of 3 additional outdoor courts and expanding the east parking lot requires an update to the Woods Park Master Plan.

Mr. Johnson outlined the process of updating the Master Plan. The first stage would be a proposal from Woods Tennis Center to the Parks & Recreation Department detailing how they would like to expand. The Parks & Recreation Department would begin a community involvement process that would typically last for 3-4 months. The community involvement process includes meeting with Neighborhood Associations and other stakeholders to get input on the expansion plan. The plan could then be revised based on information gathered from the community. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board would review the updated plan and make recommendations to the Parks & Recreation Department, City Council and Mayor. Eventually the City Council would need to approve any changes to the Master Plan.

Both Mr. Johnson and Mr. Yost indicated the timeline for the beginning of this process is still not known as a proposal has not been received from Friends of Woods Park Tennis, a non-profit organization that supports access to the sport.

Several expressed their appreciation for the work by Mr. Johnson and Mr. Yost in leading efforts to oversee all parks and making recreational opportunities available to all Lincolnites in all parts of the City. Stay tuned for more information about the future of Woods Park.





Little Free Pantries of Lincoln "FOOD RAISER"

The Little Free Pantries of Witherbee will be hosting a "Food Raiser" event on June 11th to help bring in donations of non-perishable food to help re-supply The Little Free Pantries of Lincoln. What is a "Food Raiser"? A "Food Raiser" is much like a "Fund Raiser"- with a twist. Instead of soliciting funds we will instead be asking for donations of non-perishable food. In exchange for donations we will have tables set up with free clothing that donors can "shop" from.

Little Free Pantries are set up in yards and driveways of citizens all over Lincoln. They offer free food, hygiene products, and daily essentials on a 24 hour basis to those in need, on fixed incomes, or homeless. All you do is drive up or walk up and take what you need and, if you can, leave what you can. There are over 30 pantries in Lincoln with five of them right here in the Witherbee Neighborhood. Those pantries are located at 380 South 44th St., 612 South 42nd St., 3755 J St., and 4115 Lenox Ave., and at Redeemer Lutheran Church, 510 S. 33rd St. A full listing of all the Little Free Pantries can be found on Facebook by looking up "Little Free Pantries LNK".

Our event will coincide with the Witherbee Neighborhood Garage Sales so save the date! Plan to participate in the "Food Raiser" at Christo Rey Church, 4221 J St, June 11th, 9-5 pm. Look for signs the day of the event to direct you to the area within Christo Rey where the event will be held.


As neighbors can see by passing by the site, grading has begun in preparation for the construction stage of this unique project. Tabitha is currently in the permit process.

Lincoln Pharmacy Helps Afghan Refugees

Faheem Rashidi and his wife, Rabia, owners of Lincoln Pharmacy at 33rd and A Street, came to Lincoln from Afghanistan in 2000. Today they are giving back by helping a new wave of refugees arriving in Nebraska.

Faheem was only 8 when his father died and his mother walked, with her children, to a refugee camp in Pakistan. After 8 years of living in tents, he and his sisters emigrated to Lincoln, where their first home was the basement of a church in Havelock. Kate and Tim Pieper, the family's sponsors through Catholic Social Services provided care and food – and have remained good friends.

"At that time, we could not speak English, and we did not eat the first night because I did not know how to open a can," Faheem recalls. "I came here with nothing and I had all these opportunities. I was thinking to myself if, at age 16, I have to start everything from scratch, why not just work hard and follow my dreams?" Faheem learned English with Lincoln Literacy classes at many of Lincoln's churches. After 3 years as an ESL student, he was admitted to UNL and earned awards for excellence. He then went on to complete his pharmacology degree at Creighton. This was fulfilling his mother's goal that he would be the first of his generation to graduate college.

One night, Tim Pieper took Faheem to the Old Country Buffet, where he met Rabia, who was the waitress. Both had arrived in Lincoln a few months before and attended school together. They have been married 12 years now, and Faheem's eyes light up when he talks of his son and three daughters, ages 3-9.

Faheem and Rabia are heavily involved in helping the city's newest Afghan refugees adjust to life in Lincoln. Faheem stresses that "the first thing the refugee families need is a welcoming smile and to

be considered part of the community. Next is help with learning English".

"Reflecting on what I went through, language is the biggest challenge", he said. "If you can't speak, you can't talk to the doctor, buy food or ask for help. We make sure they get through that first period of "where am I"?



"I am so grateful that we have wonderful support from every corner. Not everywhere in the world do you get this opportunity we have here now. In this beautiful country you have opportunity to help other people, why not do it?

What are we going to take when we leave this world? I think we all leave empty-handed so if we have this opportunity to help, I will do it. Refugee families get encouraged, they go to school, and they contribute back to the society."

Faheem feels that opening Lincoln Pharmacy was the best decision. "In this wonderful neighborhood, people come here and say 'Welcome to the Community'. "I want to say thank you to all the wonderful people."
