#### LPD K9 Unit Presentation to Witherbee Residents

A full house attended the Lincoln Police Department's K9 Unit presentation September 10th at S2age Living on the Tabitha campus. Officers Howard, Housh and Arnold spoke while canine's Eros and Dredd showed off their skills. Attendees from 5 to 85 years of age learned how this special unit works to keep citizens of Lincoln safe by tracking suspects, sniffing out narcotics and detecting explosives.

Since the first LPD Officer and Canine were paired in

1961, the team has proven to be a valuable resource to LPD. The current unit consists of five canine officers and their partners. Lincoln's LPD Officers and their canines work, train, and live together creating a special bond between the officer and their dog.

## Hidden Holiday Treasure in our Neighborhood

Last January a few Witherbee neighbors met at **Cristo Rey Catholic Church**, **4221** J **St**., to view the nativity display that has become a favorite stop for hundreds of Lincolnites during the holiday season. The detailed display, which is more than 28 feet long, depicts the town of Bethlehem, the village of Nazareth, the walled city of Jerusalem, and Egypt. It features more than 200 moving and stationary figurines, running water with live fish and swirling smoke from a chimney. The display runs on a four-minute cycle, portraying night and day.

According to José Herraro, artistic director and one of the organizers, many pieces featured in the display are from all over the world. There is a stone from the Sea of Galilee, icons from Egypt, and pieces from Italy and Spain.

A group of dedicated volunteers work around the clock for a week to ensure the intricate display is ready for visitors by mid-December. While there is no admission fee, donations are appreciated. In the past, proceeds have gone to support Catholic communities overseas and a local charity, the St. Vincent DePaul Society, which supports those in need in and around Lincoln.

#### Witherbee Tree Idea Takes Root

Ten trees were planted in the western section of Witherbee Neighborhood on September 26th & 27th. The new trees look great and will only get better as they mature. Planting the trees was the culmination of work started by Mary Schwab several months ago. Mary wanted to plant trees in the neighborhood to replace some of the trees that had been lost to storm damage, old age and street projects.

Mary found that the Nebraska Statewide Arboretum sponsored a grant program that provides free trees to organizations that will plant and maintain the trees in public spaces.



Tree planting perfection!

In this case the public space was to fill in missing "street" trees. A street tree is a tree planted in the public right of way between the sidewalk and street. Mary brought her tree idea to WNA and a tree com-

mittee was formed with members Mary, Mike Kreikemeier & Kathy Holland. The committee found a tree expert in Pete Smith. Pete retired from a career with the Arbor Day Foundation. The committee applied for the tree grant in July and was awarded 10 trees in August.

Then the work really began. The committee did an inventory in the western section of Witherbee neighborhood selecting places where street trees were missing. Next, a tree interest form was delivered to each household where a street tree was missing. Committee members met with many neighbors when delivering the tree interest forms. Trees and planting would be provided free of charge. The home owner only needed to agree to water the tree the first few years. Ten neighbors quickly showed enthusiastic interest in getting a new tree.

The trees were delivered from Great Plains Nursery on September 11th. The committee then asked for volunteers to help plant the trees. Home owners and tree enthusiasts stepped forward and soon tree planting teams were formed. Pete Smith provided an informative tree planting tutorial while the group planted the first of the 10 trees. 5 trees were planted on Friday and the remaining 5 trees were planted on Saturday. All of the trees were mulched and watered. Thanks to all of the neighbors that helped make Witherbee more Green. Thanks to Pete Smith for all his help and guidance and thanks to Nebraska Statewide Arboretum for sponsoring the Tree grant program. Hopefully this tree grant program will continue for several more years and WNA can plant street trees throughout the neighborhood. Planting trees in Witherbee every year will pay big dividends for decades.
