Spring Cleanup is Saturday, May 3rd

It's time for another Spring Cleanup. The annual WNA Cleanup is May 3rd, from 8 am-Noon. This is a great way to dispose and recycle unwanted items when cleaning up your garage, your yard and your home. The collection site will be along M Street directly North of Bryan Community School (48th and M Street).

The Goodwill collection is returning this year. You can drop off household and clothing items plus computer electronics for donation to Goodwill.

We are also asking for bicycles. If you have unused bicycles bring them to the collection site and they will be donated to Lincoln Bike Kitchen (LBK). Volunteers at the LBK refurbish the bicycles and give them to people in need of a bicycle for transportation and recreation. LBK is especially in need of childrens and small adult bikes.

Of course we are also accepting the usual items such as: mattresses, box springs and old furniture. In addition to safely disposing of items, recycling and reusing are also a big part of the cleanup. Tires are taken to Firestone Complete Auto Care at 300 N 66th St. to be recycled. No tires mounted on rims are accepted. Metal and household appliances (washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, grills, etc.) are delivered to Alter Trading for recycling. Appliances with freon are safely discharged before recycling. Construction material and items such as windows and doors from building/remodeling projects as well as leftover lawn and landscaping materials and furniture in good condition are collected and donated to Habitat for Humanity ReStore at 5601 S 59th St.





Brush coupons will be available by request. A brush coupon allows dumping of one load of brush (sticks, twigs, small branches - NO LEAVES or TRASH) at the 48th Street transfer station for free.

Yes there are items that CANNOT be accepted. These include: trash, leaves, grass clippings, liquids of any kind (including paint, thinners, stains) ammunition/explosives, LP gas cylinders and CRT televisions and CRT computer monitors.

If you need help hauling items to the collection site email president@witherbeena.org or call the WNA phone line at 402-413-0156 and make an appointment by leaving a message. The items must be easily accessible and placed near the curb for our volunteers to pickup on May 3rd.

Many volunteers are required to make this event a success. Please consider helping for a few hours to clean up the neighborhood by doing litter pick-up. Volunteers should arrive at the collection site (48th and M Street) to sign in. Gloves, safety vests and other equipment will be provided. Thanks to Mid-Town Hy-Vee for donating coffee, juice and donuts to fuel all of the volunteers.

Reporting a Crime

Reporting to the Lincoln/Lancaster County Crime Stoppers is the only way to remain anonymous and/or be eligible for up to \$1,000 in rewards.

To make your report to Lincoln/Lancaster County Crime Stoppers choose any one of three methods:

- Call to speak with a Crime Stoppers call-taker at (402) 475-3600
- -Leave an online tip at: https://lincolncrimestoppers. com or to give them a general tip about something not posted on the site.
- -Download the App to report tips to Lincoln/ Lancaster County Crime Stoppers. https://www.p3tips.com/tipform.aspx?ID=596

Remember to include the CASE NUMBER with your tip, so they know what crime-case you're talking about.



Witherbee Tree Walk May 31st

Have you ever walked around the neighborhood and asked, "I wonder what kind of tree that is?" or, "Should I call the city about that dead limb?" or, "How do I get a new tree planted in front of my home?" The answers to all these questions—and more—will be offered on the first Witherbee Tree Walk. Join local urban forester, certified arborist, and Lincoln Community Forestry Advisory Board member, Pete Smith, on a one-hour walk through the neighborhood on May 31.

Pete will explain the role of the city forestry team and Lincoln residents in the planting and tending of our street tree population—in that space between the sidewalk and the curb along most city streets. As a professional urban forester and arborist, Pete has more than 30 years experience assisting communities develop sound tree programs based on the latest research and practice. We will learn how to report a dead or damaged tree to keep our streets safe, as well as identify locations where a new tree can be planted; how to find funding for new trees; how to properly tend a young tree; and which species are best suited for planting along our streets.

Meet at Redeemer Lutheran Church, 510 S 33rd St. Saturday, May 31st at 9 am in the parking lot. The walk will begin and end there.


