## Recent concern in our neighborhood:

In a 3+ acre area between 40th and 42nd and Randolph and J streets a development referred to as **Randolph Square** as it has been presented would establish a **100 child daycare facility** and two 16 unit apartment/condo buildings for an increase of **32 units** in the neighborhood. Our neighborhood has had several meetings to discuss an alternative to the proposed development. Our major concerns have centered on the effect this would have on the character of the neighborhood, traffic, and the effect on the quality of life our neighborhood has come to enjoy.
